From the Pastor

On Sunday, May 19, we will welcome seven people as members of the congregation. Ben and Linda Benjamin, Kam and Dave Padlina, and Jeanne Hyatt will be joining as voting members of the congregation. Lynn Wadnizak and David Sweeney are joining as associate members.

What's the difference between voting and associate membership? All of them have expressed a desire to participate in the life and mission of our congregation. Voting members have voting privileges at called meetings of the congregation, may serve on Church Council, and may serve as delegates to Synod Assembly. Associate members typically hold membership in another congregation, where they would have those privileges.

When I meet with them to discuss membership, I often tell people that membership is making commitment to being a part of a community of believers. They make a commitment to being part of *us*, and *we* make a commitment to *them*. Just as they commit to living out their baptismal promises in the community, the community promises to support and pray for the new members.

Every time we welcome new members, both the gifts and the needs of the congregation shift. Sometimes they shift in obvious ways, sometimes in ways that are more subtle, as new ideas, new understandings, new questions arise. How we navigate those changes is a part of the way we offer grace to each other, a part of the way we practice peace within the walls of the building.

My favorite part of the ritual is the promise all of us make at the end: "Together we will give thanks and praise to God and proclaim the good news to all the world." It's a reminder that we are all part of the Body of Christ, with a shared hope and mission.

Getting to Know You

When do you know you are in a church as opposed to any other building? What makes it different, even feel different and sound different? For most of us I'm sure its when we see a large cross or the altar. These are permanent structures, but at Our Saviour's Lutheran Church there are many things that change in the course of a year. Most obvious are the banners and the color of the altar cloth, not to mention the spotlessly clean area. And on Sundays we have music; the selection of which changes according to the church season and the sermon topic.

Who knows about all this and takes care of it? At OSLC it's the Worship and Music Committee, of which Dennis Allwein is a dedicated member.

Dennis was raised in Modesto, California, learned to play the trombone in the fourth grade and went to Lutheran Bible School. He joined the Navy in 1963, and served on the troop ship USNS Weigel in Pearl Harbor, Hawaii, and Johnston Island for a total of six years.

Upon returning to civilian life Dennis recalls, with great satisfaction, being a scout master from 1980 to 1989 and continuing his education at PLU. Majoring in English and history led to teaching, but that did not suit him. A better fit was at Central Lutheran Church in Portland where for 18 years he was their sacristan. A move to Seaside brought him to our church, which he joined in 2010, plus giving him the opportunity to participate in three local music groups that he happily gives many hours of practice.
